CALL TO CONFESSION

L: Genuine repentance involves two things: the dying-away of the old self and the coming-to-life of the new. The coming-to-life of the new self is wholehearted joy in God through Christ and a delight to do every kind of good as God wants us to. Together, as Christ's body, we now confess our sin and express our longing to live in joyful obedience to God.
